### XI. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Throughout the month of November, Sussex County ESC had many moments that showed the gratitude and thanks that we are known for. At NHA the students and staff celebrated the remembrance of our Veteran's, demonstrated acts of kindness within our school setting and outside with our community collaborators. In addition, the sharing of food and supplies to our school community, was a prime example of the kindness that can be extended.

Many of our traditional activities at NHA have been hampered by our precautions being taken for Covid but our staff really have pulled together creative and innovative ideas to support the traditions. It has definitely taken a significant amount of time in planning and implementation of the modified activities. Kudos to the staff members that are taking the lead on these areas. These events included holiday activities around Thanksgiving, annual fire truck show with Sparta Fire Department, Veteran's Day and School Picture day.

November also had multiple opportunities for SCESC staff members to shine. Professional opportunities for staff to explore and/or lead activities in the areas of technology, diversity and social skills/communication were made available. Superintendent attended Women's Leadership Cohort through AESA, and Leadership/Diversity through NJASA. Principal Cook has been an integral part of the Sussex/Warren Child Study Team Director's meetings. Our related services Speech staff and Social Worker Paige Ortega held a session entitled, "Collaboration w/ Counseling"- Social Emotional Language & Communication." John O'Hara, Project Search Director and Superintendent attended YIC meeting to

discuss job development opportunities in Sussex County. In addition, Mr. O'Hara reached out to all of the high school CST Director's to schedule individual school district Zoom Open House invites for 2022-2023 Project Search Program.

Superintendent Roundtable had the Superintendent's and the Sussex County Prosecutor's Office with Chief of Police/Sheriff's Office and NJ State Police on hand to sign the Memorandum of Agreement with the Executive County Superintendent. This was the first time that we have all been in the same place to sign the MOA. It was an opportunity to touch base, speak openly and showcase the relationships that have developed with our local law enforcement.

Non Public programming continues to grow as the first marking period ends. Student referrals have increased and meetings with non-public directors are ongoing. Conversations that identify any areas of concerns have been held with public schools, updates on funding and allocations have been provided to non public schools.

Although November is a shortened month, the business office was kept incredibly busy with billing, meeting requests of the auditor and updating student contract revisions. Itinerant programming continues to grow and provides services to so many districts.

# **Northern Hills Academy**

November was focused on our theme of Giving Thanks. What are we thankful for at NHA? We are thankful for all of our incredible staff that push our students to meet their full potential each and every day. We are thankful for all of the parents and family members that continue to support their children through their time at NHA. We are also thankful for all of the extra activities we were able to do this month such as Community Club, Girls Club, Mindfulness Mondays, Garden Club, Walking Club, and Sports Club.

NHA celebrated our Veterans with homemade cards and letters that were sent out to our special friends that served our country. We also celebrated World Kindness Day and Thanksgiving with several fun and educational activities in the classrooms. Special November themes this month focused on Native Americans, Diwali, Colonization and Settlement, and Good and Services. We also explored Election Day and Democracy.

In collaboration with the Sparta Community Food Pantry, we sent home over 40 bags of food to our NHA families during the month of November. This will continue throughout the year. NHA's Community Club led by teachers, Stephanie DeFelice and Karra Hansen-Mueller, created wonderful Thanksgiving letters, crafts, and cards with the students for our community friends at the Chelsea in Sparta.

We look forward to the upcoming holiday season and a wonderful December.

### **Project Search**

Interns are over the halfway point in their first rotation. This is exciting as they are near the end of the rotation and their Employment Planning Meetings will be scheduled early in December. At these meetings, their first rotations are discussed and strengths are identified by the intern and their assigned job coach/developers.

The classroom instruction portion has been focusing on topics such as Conflict Resolution at home and in the workplace. Through our classroom lessons and discussInterns have also been identifying different ways to keep motivated and to finish this first rotation STRONG. Additional topics such as in demand occupations and respective salaries are always areas that are stressed, so interns know what to expect.

A project of putting patient admission bags together for Patient Experience & Volunteer Services continues and the interns feel great that they are helping the hospital care for the patients.

Project Search marketing efforts continue through the following activities:

- Emails with flyers are being sent out to all Sussex, Warren and Morris County School CST offices asking that they send to parents of students in special education
- Zoom meetings for Open Houses are being set up.
- Posters created by Atlantic Health were made and will be distributed to the all high schools/special ed/guidance departments.
