XII. SUPERINTENDENT’S REPORT *ADDED*

Northern Hills Academy

We had so many activities throughout the month of April and planned for the month of May. We ended the month of August with our Autism Walk. We had several parents involved in the walk with us and our students. Students made tactile cookies and cupcakes. So many positive interactive activities for students to help with keeping our sensory areas regulated. Students made birdhouses with PT, used sensory buckets filled with a variety of tactile sensory materials, cracking ice to get to the bottom and face painting with Speech.

We had a bonus visit from Northern Regional ESC's Therapy Dog Pearl. The students really loved the opportunity to hang out with the puppy and enjoyed having the therapy dog on campus.

The superintendent participated in several meetings through NJASA- and was able to help support programming under NJASA in areas of special education and non-public programming.

The month of May, although it just started, is hopping already. We held our Science Fair and had 90% of the students participating in so many different science experiments from bubbology to creating mechanical hands. Many students utilized theories in science regarding gravity, compounds and circuits.

Along with state testing for the DLM and the NJSLA, students were focused on the final marking period. They are involved in building their portfolios and creating as many fun filled engaging activities throughout the remainder of the year. Students attended the food pantry and Dunkin as part of their community based instruction. Task analysis of spring activities began with the Gardening Club run by Teacher Nadine Wilson. Lego Club is starting for the Spring led by Teacher Brian Wittman and Social Worker Wade Dendy. Mother's Day- paint and Sp (lemonade/tea) was held and led by Teacher Chloe Smith.

Staff appreciation activities were abundant the first week in May.

Our Scholastic Book Fair will be happening the 2nd week in May.

Project Search

- The interns have been working hard in their final rotation
- The interns continue to practice their interview skills with our Job Coach. He is now having the interns answer questions on their own, The interns are able to get a real life experience of how an interview will be.
- The PS continues having conversations with each intern's parents to assist us with job placement ideas. We recommend a 5 mile radius from the interns home because most intern parents will be driving them.
- Some interns have applied for employment and all are going through the application process.
- Pictures continue to be posted on the Atlantic Health website and the Atlantic Health staff have also posted pictures letting the interns know how much they love the program.
- The Nourish and Flourish nursing internship is going very well. Our intern Riddhi was recognized by the nursing department staff for a job well done! She was recognized during the "Cheers for Peers" monthly hospital celebration where staff members are recognized for their hard work.
- All Project Search graduates have been signed up for the Project Search Alumni Association. This is a great opportunity for interns from around the country and all around the world to contact each other. It is also a great way for the interns to keep track of what's going on in Project Search.
- Mt Olive School District sent one adult and one student intern candidate to go on a tour of the program. They attended with their guardian. The guardian for each was impressed with the program and were looking to apply.
- PS was well represented at the Atlantic Health monthly Leadership meeting for May to give departments a better idea of how Project Search interns can assist in their departments and the success we have had with the hospital as a team.
- Project Search set up information tables at the "Autism Awareness and Special Needs Resource Fair" in Phillipsburg, the "Career and Health Fair" held by Project Self Sufficiency in Newton, the "Transition Fair" by The Calais School in Whippan, the "Sussex Autism Resource Fair" at the Sussex County Library, and also the biggest New Jersey Transition Fair held at Boonton High School in partnership with DVRS and The DAWN Center for Independent Living. These are all a great way to get the Project Search program information out into the community and through other services. Attending the Sussex Library resource fair will open up possible night 'Info Classes' where the community can attend classes at the library and learn more about what Project Search is all about. When we were present in Phillipsburg, a positive conversation was had with their Superintendent about how they might in the future be able to utilize our services.

- A positive meeting was had with the Jefferson School District and DVRS about their student that they are having attend Project Search in September.
- Project Search was represented at a nice luncheon event “Getting to Know You” for the Adult Transition Center at Sussex County Community College. It was a nice networking event.
- PS Supervisor was invited to participate in the “Education and Business” Roundtable discussion with the Sussex County Chamber of Commerce. It was good to network with others in the community and school districts.
- Project Search was represented at the Sussex County Community College Presidents Inauguration for Dr. Cory Homer. The Sussex County community was present in this special event and was a perfect gathering to make connections with heads of the community and spread the PS word.
- The Lieutenant Governor of New Jersey invited John O’ Hara to the NJ Faith Action Center in Neptune NJ to network with nonprofit organizations, state resources and interagency partnerships. It was a great event to show all that we can work together in assisting with educational needs
- We had a Corporate visit to AHS in Morristown. The Atlantic Health staff did an incredible job. It was a great day and so important for the interns to see where the corporate office is and its various functions. The speakers were very impressive and we all had a free lunch!
- Graduation is all set for June 12th from 10:am-12:00pm at The Romano Center in Newton.

Non Public and Itinerant Programming

It is that time of year again!!! Superintendent Andrea Romano meets with each of the public schools to discuss the Non Public Consultation Agreements. At these meetings we discuss the changes with the NP Programming for the current year and with the changes to funding this year, the discussions are strong. Because the NJDOE has not provided clarification and/or guidelines to anyone yet.

Itinerant programming continues to grow as many districts are utilizing the CST and Related Services sections of SCESC. There has been strong interest in programming for ESY and specifically in areas of BCBA.

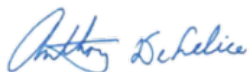
