XI. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Highlights from the Superintendent include tremendous focus on the budget passing in March and the audit presentation. In addition, work to come to completion is the collective bargaining agreement and the Superintendent's contract, plus Superintendent evaluation occurred.

The never ending cycle of recruitment with ads posted in local and state newspapers, online at NJhire.com, in numerous Sussex County facebook groups, posted at Sussex Community College and Morris County Community College, with Centenary University and sent to all CST Director's/Superintendent's and BOE members. Advertisements have also been placed in the Star Ledger and the NJ Herald. We are short staffed currently, and planning for an opening for ESY that will also see NHA short-staffed.

With just a few short weeks left, staff evaluations are almost 100% complete before our personnel committee reviews them...It is essential to complete these by our timelines and to meet with staff to review their performance. Our consultants are actively finishing up the evaluations from Fredon/Hopatcong.

Superintendent held a workshop on the Fish Philosophy at Hamburg School District and is happy to say that Superintendent Dr. Kim Sigman reached out with nothing but positives to report.

Superintendent attended NJASA Government Relations meeting, Sussex County DOE Summer Think Tank meeting, a regional roundtable of the educational leaders in Northeastern States, and NJASA Diversity and Inclusion meeting.

Northern Hills Academy

March was a literacy-packed month of novels, nonfiction, fantasy, and fun! March's Monthly Curricular Themes were Famous Authors, Women in History, Nutrition, and the Science of Spring. For our March Professional Development and staff meetings, staff were provided training in Dynamic Learning Maps, NJSLA, and Google Suite Troubleshooting with Planet Network. We are currently getting ready for the Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) state assessment for students with special needs, starting in April.

We filled March with amazing opportunities and instructional activities for our students at NHA. A huge celebration of reading for Read Across America was held this month. We had over 15 Celebrity Readers including local politicians, community business members, community helpers, and our very own Board members. Highlights included Prosecutor Koch, Senator Oroho, Commissioners Petillo and Anthony Fasano, a recent Hopatcong BOE member. A special thank you to Ms. Katie Tackaberry, Speech therapist, and Ms. Corrie Pisciottano for all their hard work in organizing and executing this special event. A local author and previous employee, Lisa Laganella, also came to NHA to read to our students. It was a wonderful experience for everyone.

This month, we made time to reach out to our community partnerships. Ms. Karra Hansen-Mueller's class organized classes in making beautiful St. Patrick's Day and spring creations for our friends at the Veterans' Hospital and The Chelsea at Sparta, a senior assisted living community. Thank you to our teachers, Ms. Karra Hansen-Mueller and Ms. Stephanie DeFelice, and their classes for their hard work.

Project Search

This month was about marketing and student employment meetings. Supervisor John O'Hara has been busy with weekly information sessions flyers for Project SEARCH. These informational sessions have been sent to CST members to send to their parents/students. Project Search offers an info session every Wednesday from 10am-11am and again in the evening from 7pm-8pm. Directly Mr. O'Hara has established connections with new supervisors and directors of special education.

Marketing for the program continues to be 1:1 visits and tours of the program by families and potential candidates. Mr. O'Hara completes these tours and then follows up directly with the school staff and/or parents. Out of the 5 tours given, 4 of the students have applied. The 1 student did not apply because of the COVID vaccine mandate. We now have seven applicants for the Program for the 2022-2023 school year.

Currently the interns started their third and final rotation for the year. The Project Search interns just completed the financial literacy section of the classroom training. The students ended this larger unit with check endorsement. Health and fitness along with time management will continue through the end of the classroom instruction year.

Interns have continued putting patient admission bags together for Patient Experience & Volunteer Services and the interns feel great that they are helping the hospital care for the patients. If Hackettstown Medical Center needs further assistance they will contact us. At Newton Medical Center, the Materials Department had a luncheon for the assigned intern who had positive compliments reported both verbally and through email. Employee recognition is essential and Atlantic Health Services does a beautiful job in including our interns. We are still involved in visiting each department with a cart full of free snacks for employees with Reverend Randy. The administration has this initiative to thank all employees for their hard work and dedication.

As for the fidelity of the program and for the sustainability of candidate success, one adult intern was hired at Hackettstown Hospital in Food Services. He is in the onboarding process now and will be starting April 28th. An additional adult intern in the program will be getting interviewed for Environmental Services this week. The supervisor already told me they want him to work at Newton Medical Center. This is two examples of the win-win collaboration of Atlantic Health, Abilities and Sussex County ESC. When discussing the transferability of skills, we had two interns attend a job fair with our skills trainer from Abilities at Crystal Springs. One intern was hired on the spot and will start part time weekends ASAP and for the other intern, Crystal Springs reported they will be getting back to him this week.

Additional support for the program include Supervisor John O'Hara conducting a Parent training Webinar with The ARC of NJ called "Planning is Vital." He also attended OSHE Career Accelerator Internship Grant Informational Session and The Facing the Future Virtual Event through The BOGGS Center. Mr. O'Hara led an Information Session in Phillipsburg with Abilities to promote Project SEARCH. Both Supervisor and Superintendent attended the Project Search Statewide meeting virtually. Finally, International Project Search has requested that our program complete an abstract proposal for the Project Search National Convention in July 2022 in Baltimore. The request was made to the Superintendent to outline the successful journey of an intern to sustainable employment, based on a recent graduate of our program.

The best part of the month would have to be the six intern Employment Planning Meetings. These planning meetings showcase the interns and what they think about their performance on the job. It includes Mr. O'Hara, Superintendent Romano, parent, DVR counselor, Abilities Skill Trainer, their Mentor from Newton Medical Center and the intern. Each intern reflects on how their strengths and weaknesses led to performance reviews. The interns speak to their successes and/or their challenges. They round out the meeting by discussing their final rotation.

XII. BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

On Thursday night, with the thunderstorms in the area, the fire alarm panel was fried. They are not sure if it came in through the phone lines or the electrical lines. ABCODE was on site on Friday to install a new panel.

The business office is working with Brown & Brown regarding the open enrollment for health insurance and we have a meeting scheduled for this Thursday.

Mr. Zitone is scheduled to do the concrete work the week of spring break. The railings will be done that week or the week after if they run out of time.
